Per the H.O.G® Handbook:

All H.O.G.® members are eligible to join any affiliated local Chapter by completing the Chapter Membership Enrollment Form and Release. Applicants are responsible for providing proof of their National membership. An expired National membership automatically terminates local Chapter membership and any associated memberships.

Life and associate memberships cannot be offered at the local Chapter level - these are national designations only. All Chapter members must renew their Chapter membership on an annual basis and must sign the Chapter Membership Enrollment and Release Form each year.

The Kenosha HOG chapter membership runs yearly from 1-1 thru 12-31. Membership fees are not pro rated and they still come due for renewal on 12/31. The sponsoring dealership has the right to terminate a Chapter membership should his/her conduct does meet the dealerships standards or vision.





Safety

Cabin Fever Safety...

That's right, it's winter and the longing for warm days is forever on our minds. When will it end? We need to to satisfy that haunting echo in the back of our conscience, but how...

'Tis the season really means it'll be a couple of months before we have the opportunity to once again throw a leg over our two-wheeled chariots and feel the power and pleasure that only our V-twin can provide. It is also the season to consider the needs of that bike and the rider/s that it carries.

Rubber, leather, lighting, airhorns, that space between two ears, the list goes on...

Rubber, of course we're talking about two tires and ensuring that you have adequate tread to keep your grip on the road through corners and storms alike.

Leather, that outer shell that protects against the elements and the surface we ride on. Chaps and jackets provide both warmth from the chill and the comfort in know that should you go down you've given yourself a barrier from the unforgiving nature of asphalt.

Lighting, I mean LED and I mean that being seen, is one of the most important things we can do to make our presence known to those we share the road with, yep, I'm talking cagers! Front lights, headlamps, spotlights and turn signals light up the bike like no other accessory, giving a stark visual signal that says, "here I am," and that may be all it takes to keep that teenager texting at the stop-sign from pulling out in front of you. Rear lights, brake and turn signals do exactly the same thing for those on your tail, consider a brake light that pulsates when you apply the brake, it really says to those following you that same "here I am," please slow down!

Airhorns, the moment you need it, you want to make sure the offending vehicle, no matter the type, knows that you are there. A loud notice to those you share the road with just might keep you up on your bike rather than having an unwelcome outcome. If you're on the fence about the expense ask me this spring to give you a sample of my horn, it makes quite a statement!

That space between two ears, that's right I'm talking about your noggin, it's yours and it's your most valuable asset in the quest for safety on two wheels. No one knows everything when it comes to riding safely, but we all can increase our knowledge base in a number of different ways. The Motorcy-cle Safety Foundation, https://msf-usa.org/ has a online only course for just \$19.99, it seems a bargain if you learn just one trick to add to your bag of knowledge. Advance or basic rider courses are available at Uke's Harley-Davidson, just ask and you'll be on your way to a safer ride. One more thing, a good helmet never hurt anyone and it's known to have saved more than one life, give it a try!

Reach out to the service department or the parts counter to add to your bike the accessories that'll help keep you seen and heard out there. Whether you do the wrenching or have the service department take care of you needs, you won't be disappointed knowing you creating a safer experience for yourself and those you share the road with.

Experience is and will always be the greatest teacher when it comes to the road we share, but you have an arsenal of tools and knowledge at your disposal, all you have to do is begin with the first step. It will be a journey that should provide you with years of riding enjoyment with friends and others you encounter on this wild ride we call life!
